#### Call for contributions

The fifth meeting is envisaged as primarily responding to completing of development of the final Draft CPM Report for Agenda item 1.17. Therefore, there is the urgency for inputs by the Membership to the next meeting in order to finalize the CPM text. To this end, but not exclusively, the editorial notes and place-holders in different sections of the CPM Report (Annex 1 to Document 5-6/136) provide important guidance.

The study (as described in Annex 7 to Document 5-6/136) on the effect of cumulative interference to the broadcasting service from the mobile service needs to be accomplished in order to have greater clarity on the Methods to satisfy Agenda item 1.17 in case of protection of the broadcasting service in countries, which are Contracting Members of the GE06 Agreement.

JTG 5-6 has much work still to accomplish in relation to the JTG 5-6 report on sharing studies in response to Resolution **749** (WRC-07). Members are urged to continue to support the important work represented by this item.

Written contributions are essential to ensure timely and efficient progress on the above issues. Participants are, therefore, invited to review the progress made and to submit written contributions that advance the successful completion of the work in the limited time left to Joint Task Group 5-6 to finalize its business.
