# Participation/Visa requirements

Delegate/participant registration for the meeting will be carried out online via the ITU-R website. ## Visa requirements

We would like to remind delegates and participants that citizens of some countries are required to obtain a visa in order to enter and spend time in Switzerland. The visa must be requested at least three (3) weeks prior to the opening of the meeting and obtained from the office (embassy or consulate) representing Switzerland in the respective country of origin. In cases where there is no such office in the country, the visa should be obtained from the office that is closest to the country of departure. If problems are encountered, the Union can, at the official request of the administration or entity being represented, approach the competent Swiss authorities in order to facilitate the delivery of the visa, however, this procedure will require three weeks as mentioned above. Any such request must be accompanied by the approved registration form related to the ITU conference or meeting in question.

# Visa requests

#### Call for contributions

Administrations and Sector Members are kindly requested to prepare sharing studies and to develop draft CPM text for the next meeting on all subjects that are considered sufficiently mature, as well as carefully reviewing the existing draft text.

In order to pursue further studies in the JTG 5-6 the following areas require consideration and subsequent submission of contributions by the JTG 5-6 members:

- During the consideration of the work in SWG-1, it was noted, in a number of instances, that system characteristics and other data are currently of a preliminary nature or are not yet available. While acknowledging this situation, it was also recognised that the work of the JTG 5-6 should move forward with the "best available" characteristics. Participants in the work of the JTG 5-6 are strongly encouraged to continue to submit material in order to improve and complete this information. This applies to all four terrestrial services under consideration and especially to the mobile and broadcasting services.
- During the consideration of the work in SWG-2, it was noted that in order to carry out proper sharing studies it is essential to take into consideration the so-called activity factor which reflects the temporal statistics of the activity of the mobile terminals. This information is required both in a form to be used in Monte-Carlo simulations as well as such that can be cast into analytical probabilistic formulas to be used with deterministic models described in the text. Furthermore, mobile terminals make use of power control algorithms. Some information on that issue has been already included into the methodology document (Annex 7); however, a critical review is needed.
- The suggested wave propagation model based on elements of the Recommendation ITU-R P.1546-3 and the Okumura-Hata model (referenced in Report ITU-R SM.2028) to address sharing studies between the broadcasting and the mobile services needs a careful check for the purpose of any inconsistencies, flaws, and incorrectness.
- It was noted that a list of definitions could be developed as it had been found that different participants, each with their different specialties, could benefit in their work in the JTG 5-6 from an improved knowledge of the specialized terms and concepts used by the other participants. It is suggested that work be done on such a list for presentation at the third JTG 5-6 meeting.

• Participants in the work of the JTG 5-6 are also encouraged to prepare further input contributions to the next meeting of the JTG 5-6 noting the guidance provided by the editorial notes and place-holders in different annexes to this report.

This list above may not be exhaustive but it is intended to provide a guide for the missing information required to properly conduct sharing studies and develop the draft CPM text relevant to Agenda item 1.17. The ITU-R membership is urged strongly to submit contributions to the next meeting of the JTG 5-6.
