

# **Africa Region Prep-Meetings**





- Three meetings held.
  - Cairo, Egypt
  - Durban, South Africa 21-25 May 2012.
  - Accra, Ghana
- Agreed on almost all the Articles of the ITRs.



#### **ITR Preamble**







- the African position stresses on the purpose of the ITRs:
- "promoting the development of telecommunication services and their most
   <u>efficient operation</u> while <u>harmonizing the</u>
   <u>development</u> of facilities for world-wide telecommunications."

# **Article 1: Scope of the ITRs**







- The ITRs are applicable to Member States;
- Transfer of Obligations to OA via the CS.
- Very few Recommendations shall be obligatory (e.g. having policy and regulatory impact – e.g. those approved by TAP)

#### **Article 2: Definitions**







- New definitions:
  - Fraud.
  - Origination Identification.
- Defining Spam is related to a "definition of a concept" not a "term".
- Possible Definition for a new term [Telecommunications/ICT]

#### **Article 3: Networks**





- Ensure cooperation of OAs for "Satisfactory Quality of Service (QoS)"
- and be maintained to the greatest extent practicable and as much as possible, corresponding to relevant ITU-T Recom.
- OAs agree on the route of traffic.
- Application of ITU-T Recom. for numbering, avoidance of numbering misuse.
- CPND and Origin Identification be provided to the greatest extend as per ITU-T Recom.

#### **Article 4 : Services**





- Conformance to the greatest extent practicable to ITU-T Recommendations including satisfactory QoS.
- Ensure transparency of end-user prices and the provision of clear information on how to access the services and the prices thereof, in particular to avoid unreasonable or surprising bills.



# **Article 5: Safety**





- Adopt policies that, to the greatest extent practicable, ensure safety of life telecommunications.
- Encourage OA to apply relevant ITU-T Recom. including: priority.
- MS ensure that OA acknowledge and provide emergency numbers free of charge.



### **Article 5A: Security and Confidence**





- MSs should cooperate regarding telecom security matters (including cybersecurity), in particular to develop technical standards and acceptable legal norms, including among others those regarding territorial jurisdiction and sovereign responsibility.
- MSs shall cooperate to harmonize national laws, jurisdictions, and practices in the areas of: the investigation and prosecution of [cybercrime] (including eavesdropping and breach of privacy of telecommunications); data preservation, retention, protection (including personal data protection), and privacy; and approaches for network defence and response to cyber attacks.
- MS ensure that OA Combat Fraud.

### **Article 5B: Spam**





 Ensure that operating agencies take appropriate measures to prevent the propagation of spam.

# **Article 6: Economic & Policy 1**







- Transparency to retail prices and QoS.
- Invest in Wideband Infrastructure.
- Promote Whole Sale Cost-Oriented Pricing.
- Fair compensation for carried traffic.
- OA establish mutual commercial agreements with providers of international communication applications and services in alignment with principles of fair competition, innovation, adequate quality of service and security.

# **Article 6: Economic & Policy 2**








- OA right to charge providers of international communication applications and services appropriate access charges based on the agreed quality of service.
- MS shall ensure that rates (in particular transit rates, termination rates, and roaming rates) are cost-oriented.
- [MS may take necessary measures to optimize the utilization of the facilities of operating agencies in their territories and to ensure their sustainable development]

# **Article 6: Economic & Policy 3**







 Operating agencies shall by mutual agreement, on the basis of cost orientation, establish and revise accounting, transit and termination rates.

 Having access to alternative dispute resolution mechanisms and will have recourse to the relevant regulatory or competition authorities of the other party's state.

# **Article 7: Suspension of Service**





 Right to suspend service according to the ITU Constitution.

#### **Article 8: Disseminations of Information**





 If so authorized by the concerned Member State, the information can be transmitted to the Secretary-General directly by an operating agency and shall then be disseminated by the Secretary-General.



#### **Article 8A: Environment**



 MS cooperate to encourage OA and Industry to consider Energy Efficiency.



 MS cooperate to encourage OA and Industry to consider avoiding causing harm to other MSs.

#### **Article 9 : Special Arrangements**





Take account of ITU-T Recommendations.



 Any such special arrangements should avoid technical or financial harm to the operation of the telecommunications of third parties.

#### **Article 10: Entry into Force**





Same as RR and the Constitution.
