



### **Background to collaboration testing**



#### Key points about collaboration testing

1 Disclosure of information - Open

Nearly all business and projects (about 2000) open to the public

2 Mutual understanding between local government & CSOs - On-site

Prefectural government and CSOs develop proposals together through consultation

3 Strong will to realize testing

Collaboration proposals of CSOs are in principle approved

### Collaboration testing process

**1** Self-inspection of operation details

8 Assessment (post-implementation)

**7** Contract

- For all operations in prefectural government
- ② Operation details announced
  - ③Orientation for citizens

6 Response to proposal letter

- 4 Receipt of proposal letter
- **⑤** Consultation on proposal

### Proposals from CSOs and their adoption

## External outsourcing of delivery operations (from delivery companies to CSOs)

**Proposal** 

Want bid participation by JV method to be accepted

Sagan Enterprise, which is formed by four special needs facilities licensed to run a special mail delivery service, assigned as JV after an open tender





Supports employment and promotes social participation of people with special needs

#### What are the Public Service Awards?

- •The most prestigious international awards for excellent public service, established in 2003 by the UN Economic and Social Council (one of the six principal UN organs along with the UN Security Council, International Court of Justice, and others) based on a UN General Assembly resolution
- Awarded annually by the UN Secretary General on June 23 (UN Public Service Day)

## Response of staff when system was introduced

Orientation meetings held for staff to explain system's aims, methods, etc.

particularly in the first year,
staff felt overburdened

- Barrier of "principle of saying yes"



#### ●Example 1

#### CSO proposal-based collaboration generating project "Create an incurable disease supporters club"

Establishing a club for the purpose of network building and information exchange between businesses to support the employment of incurable disease sufferers



#### Incurable disease supporters club Saga Incurable disease patients Healthcare welfare Saga incurable organization disease support network Support Local government CSOs, etc.


- Deepen knowledge and understanding of incurable diseases and sufferers in the community
- Make it easier to self-report diseases
- •Understand the situation on the employer side and employee side
- •Aim to build a town where incurable disease sufferers are easily employed and able to continue to work

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●Example 2 CSO proposal-based collaboration generating project

### "Creating an all-Saga civic fund"

CSO composed of intermediary support organizations, etc. within the prefecture (The Saga Future Design Foundation) appeals to citizens for donations to assist CSOs that are acting to resolve local issues.



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
