


## National Challenges & Strategy for Resilience Enhancement and Economic Revitalization







## Scarring due to COVID -19

- Economy saw its deepest contraction at -16.90% in the Q2 2020
- Unemployment rate jumped to 17.6% in April 2020 and underemployment hit a high of 21% in mid -2021
- Estimated 5% of primary school -aged children in the Philippines did not enroll in 2022 while 91 percent may not be able to read or understand short and age -appropriated text by age 10.
- Country's gains in poverty reduction from 2015 to 2018 were partially reversed as the poverty incidence in 2021 increased to 18.1 percent



## Challenges

- Overwhelmed capacity of LDRRMC/s and LDRRMOs to absorb "resilience mandates"
- Glacial progress of risk mainstreaming in local plans & budgets at the wake of emerging integrated approaches
- Weaker ex-ante risk financing & budget utilization
- Gaps in knowledge management at the national and subnational level to harmonize & weave research, policymaking, & programming
- Bottom -heavy service delivery mechanism for capacity development

- Strengthen partnership with development partners and international donors (e.g. SHIELD Program with UNDP and DFAT)







#### Monitoring & Incentives

- Strengthen monitoring of LGU performance and compliance to DRR and CCA laws and policies (under the SGLG Disaster Preparedness parameters)
- Grant financial incentives to performing LGUs to fund their DRRMCCA related projects (e.g. disaster operation center, early warning system, flood Control, etc)





#### Local Infrastructure

- Enhance capacity of LGUs on development, management, operation, and M&E of local infrastructure projects on DRR
- Monitor completion of DRR related projects funded under the Local Government Support Fund (e.g. evacuation center, flood control, DRR/Rescue equipment, etc)

## Heightened Response

- Deployment of police and fire personnel, fire trucks, ambulances and rescue equipment for full disaster response
- Disseminate disaster information to field offices and LCEs to ensure proper monitoring of preparedness actions and coordination to LGUs during disasters





#### Key Message

While enhancing resilience and revitalizing local economies require a whole -of-society approach, local governments act as the "hinge" that bind all actors (across all levels) together —thus needing broader and deeper support.
