- The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) is the United Nations specialized agency for information and communication technologies (ICTs).
- Its main missions are: (1) the international allocation of radio frequencies, (2) the standardization of telecommunications, and (3) the development and improvement of telecommunications in developing countries
- Headquarters: Geneva, Switzerland, with 194 Member States
- Japan has served as one of the 48 members of the ITU Council since 1959.
- Japan is the second-largest financial contributor to the ITU after the United States, with an assessed contribution of 30 units (approximately 1.6 billion yen).
